President's Report

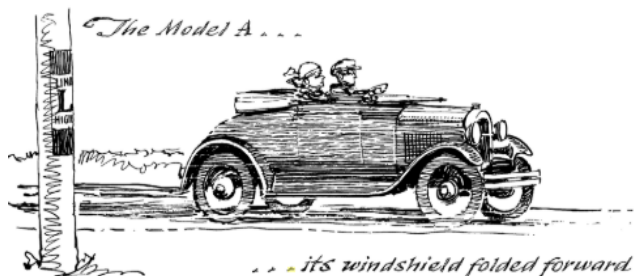

Testing Your Vacuum

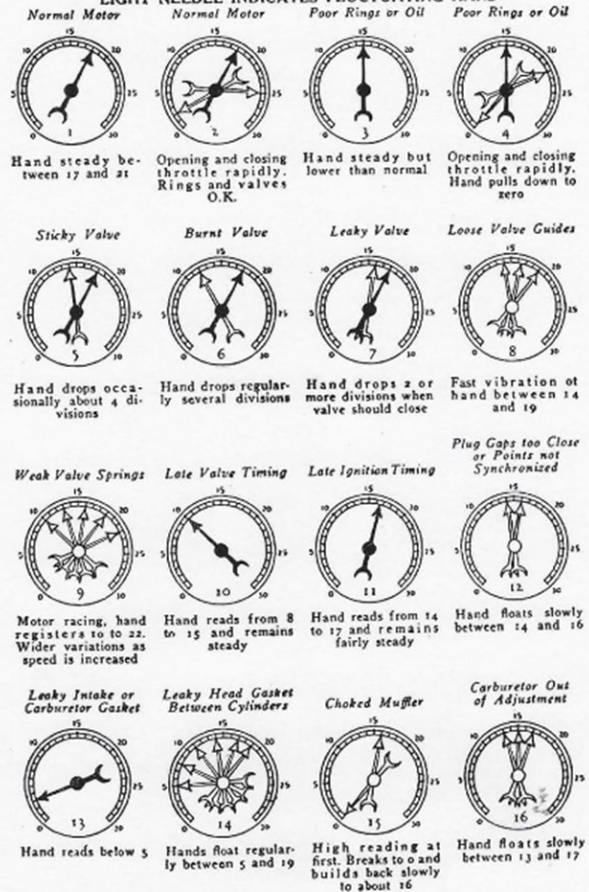
Monitoring your engine's deepest breaths can tell you a lot about its health

A vacuum test is one of the simplest and most effective diagnostic weapons the shade-tree mechanic has in his arsenal. With an inexpensive gauge, you can gain insight into the symptoms of vacuum leaks, incorrect timing, low compression, sticking valves and more. To begin, attach the gauge to the intake manifold where the wipers get their vacuum. Start the engine and let it run until it has reached normal operating temperature. Then compare the gauge readings to the table below. Remember to connect your wipers again before it starts raining!

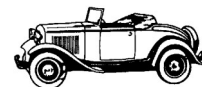
